<b>1. Are the individual items properly and adequately identified?</b> Can the casual viewer, not an expert in arms collecting, understand and learn from what he is seeing?	15	_____
<b>2. Are there related brochures, pictures, accoutrements or other items to further explain the display?</b> Are there other items in the display that assist in explaining the contents of the display?	10	_____
<b>MATERIAL OF THE DISPLAY</b>		
<b>1. Completeness: Do the items on display adequately explain display?</b> Are there enough items on display that satisfy the requirements of the title?	10	_____
<b>2. Condition: How do the items in the display compare to material available?</b> Military arms are not expected to be in mint condition, conversely highly engraved presentation arms are expected to be in excellent unused condition. Some items are so rare that fine condition is impossible to find.	10	_____
<b>3. Rarity of items on exhibit: Are rare examples displayed identified?</b> Were there many of these arms made? What is the survival rate on this type of arm? Engraving, plating, and other special features are rarity factors.	10	_____
<b>4. Collector importance of items on display: Do items on display improve or add to viewer's knowledge?</b> At a Gun Show, the collector importance of arms will always outweigh tools, accessories and any other non-firearm type of display. Strangely, some unique arms have very little collector interest.	5	_____
<b>GENERAL APPEAL</b>		
<b>1. Relative skill evidenced in design and construction of display.</b> Does the display design and construction enhance the displaying of the items displayed?	10	_____
<b>2. Neatness, general appearance and general public appeal.</b> How does the display conform to the above category?	5	_____
<b>ASSOCIATION GOALS How does the display further the goals of CGCA?</b>		
<b>1. Research and study of the history of arms and armament?</b> Does the display tell when items in display were manufactured? Relevant information on the history of items in the display is provided?	5	_____
<b>2. Disseminates this information to the members and public?</b> Can the casual viewer, after studying the display, have a better understanding of the historical significance of what is in the display.	5	_____
